

Advanced Placement Exam Information 2020-21

How do I order and pay for my AP exam?

Make your decision about taking the AP exam on myap.collegeboard.org. It is defaulted to “Yes,” so you only have to change it to “No” online if you do not want to test. Or, if you do not want to test, email Mrs. Duitsman at lduitsman@lewiscentral.org. AP fees have been added to all student Power school accounts at the start of the first trimester of their course. If students decide not to test, the fee will be removed.

You can submit a check made out to LCHS or cash to the main office or pay through school efunds.

Payment Deadline: \$40 (half) the exam fee is due before the end of your 1st trimester of your AP course (Nov. 6th, 2020 for classes beginning Tri 1 & March 4th, 2020 for classes beginning Tri 2). The remaining cost is due before you test in May. *You may choose to pay in full upfront if you choose.*

The total cost to take each AP exam is \$86 or \$53 if free or reduced lunch status

Are there any late fees/fees for unused exams, etc?

There is a \$40 late fee for exams ordered and paid for past the deadline.

What if I order and pay for an exam and decide not to test later?

Due to this year’s unusual circumstances, the unused/canceled exam fee won’t be applied this year. You will be able to get a full refund if you change your mind.

How are AP scores sent to colleges?

Students indicate their college of choice to receive their AP credit through their MyAP college board account. At the end of each school year, students can elect to send their scores to their college. Score reports are cumulative, so a student only needs to do this once when they graduate. The College Board sends notifications via email about all important AP actions, so it is important that student myap accounts are connected to a current non-school email address.

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How will AP exams be delivered this year?

The College Board is working to make both in school and online testing available this year dependent upon student and school needs. Flexibility with testing dates will also be available to schools to honor social distancing needs.

Additional Notes:

We strongly encourage that students take the AP exam to experience the full rigor of AP and to potentially receive college credit and placement. Taking AP courses and exams has a wide range of benefits, from gaining advanced content knowledge and skills, to increasing a student's ACT score, and building a strong transcript for college scholarships. If financial reasons are of concern, please contact Mrs. Duitsman regarding possible financial assistance.

Students may elect to take an AP exam even if they are not currently enrolled in an AP course. Students may do this for a number of reasons: to improve a prior test score or to obtain AP credit which may transfer better to their college of choice.
